

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE RED MOUNTAIN RESORT VOLUNTEER SKI PATROL

Qualifications for membership in the Patrol are as follows:

- Hold a valid OFA III, NUOEC, or EMT first aid certification.
- Be 19 years or older.
- Pass a ski exam given by the Director or designate.
- Be prepared to practice according to scheduling on your designated duty days.

Attendance is mandatory. It is your responsibility to ensure coverage for your shift. If you can't make your duty day you must find a replacement, either use a spare or exchange with another patroller. When this happens you must inform Dispatch as soon as possible, and fill out the exchange sheet in the Patrol Meeting Room. Keep in mind your attendance is recorded and the total number of shifts in a season is counted.

The weekend groups have a Group Leader. This person is the group's spokesperson and it's their responsibility to see that their group's duties, scheduling, and practice sessions are carried out. The midweek group reports to the Director for their practice schedule and duty days.

The Director will not have scheduled duty days. This person is the Patrol's spokesperson and it is his/her responsibility that the Patrol operates as a smooth, efficient body. He/she will remain free to make safety inspections, hold practice sessions, handle correspondence, process grievances between ski patrol, public, and management. He/she will discipline members as required up to and including dismissal, and process further applicants.

Hours of Operation/Season

The Patrol schedule starts ½ hour before the lifts open to the public, you must be ready to load the lift at this time. The day ends when sweep is complete and all patrollers are accounted for. Patrollers are expected to be available from the start of the season to the last day of operations. Exceptions are to be cleared and documented by the Director as far in advance as possible.

Probationary Period

All new patrollers will serve a probationary period of one season beginning on their first duty day and ending on their last duty day of the season. Spares that have done duty days will receive consideration for time spent.

Use of "Spares"

If a patroller uses a spare to cover his/her duty day, he/she is expected to pay that spare \$25. It is the responsibility of the scheduled patroller that the spare has the appropriate jacket and pack, and that the spare is compensated. The Director will not become a mediator in this situation.

The Britco mobile building is available to the Volunteer Patrol for equipment storage and as a change room. As there is limited space, only patrollers' equipment is allowed. The door is locked and alarmed during the off hours, if you want to get equipment out of the change room plan ahead and get it before the end of the day.
